

TERM	DEFINITION	USE IN A SENTENCE	DRAW A PICTURE
ARCHIPELAGO	<p>A string or group of islands</p> <p>A group or chain of islands clustered together in a sea or ocean</p>		
BAY	<p>Water partially or mostly surrounded by land—a <i>smaller</i> indent</p> <p>Part of a large body of water that extends into a shoreline (generally smaller than a gulf)</p>		
CAPE	<p>A point of land that sticks out into the water like an elbow</p> <p>A point of land that extends into a river, lake, or ocean</p>		
CHANNEL	<p>A <i>wider</i> body of water between two land masses</p> <p>A wide strait or waterway between two landmasses that lie close to each other</p>		

GULF	<p>Water partially surrounded by land—a <i>larger</i> indent in the land</p> <p>A large body of water that extends into a shoreline, generally larger and more deeply indented than a bay</p>		
HARBOR	<p>A safe place for boats to dock or anchor</p> <p>A shelter place along the shoreline</p>		
ISLAND	<p>A single small body of land surrounded by water</p> <p>A land area, smaller than a continent, completely surrounded by water</p>		
ISTHMUS	<p>A narrow stretch of land connecting two larger land areas</p>		

OCEANS	<p>The largest bodies of salt water</p> <p>One of five major bodies of salt water that surround the continents</p>		
PENINSULA	<p>A point of land that sticks out into the water like a thumb</p> <p>A body of land that juts into a lake or ocean, surrounded on three sides by water</p>		
SOUND	<p>Seawater between land and islands (protected by the islands)</p> <p>A body of water between a coastline and one or more islands off the coast</p>		
STRAIT	<p>A <i>narrow</i> body of water between two land masses</p> <p>A narrow stretch of water joining two larger bodies of water</p> <p>Also called a “narrows”</p>
