

TERM	DEFINITION	USE IN A SENTENCE	DRAW A PICTURE
BUTTE	<p>A flat-topped rock or hill formation with steep sides</p> <p>A tall and <i>thin</i> rock or hill that is flat on top with steep sides</p>		
CANYON	A deep and narrow valley with steep walls		
CLIFF	A steep, high wall of rock, earth, or ice		
CONTINENTS	The largest bodies of land		
DIVIDE	<p>A stretch of high land that separates river systems or watersheds from another</p> <p>Can separate the watershed of a whole continent—a continental divide!</p>		

ELEVATION	How high the land is above sea level (or how far below sea level)		
FOLDED	Mountain ranges that look like accordions		
HILL	Raised land that is smaller than a mountain		
MESA	Is tall and flat on top with steep sides, like a table  Broad, flat-topped landform with steep sides, larger than a butte		

<p>MOUNTAIN</p>	<p>Land with steep sides that rises sharply</p> <p>At least 1000 feet high</p> <p>Generally larger and more rugged than a hill</p>		
<p>PLAIN</p>	<p>Flat land at a <i>low</i> elevation</p> <p>An area of level land, usually at a low elevation, often covered with grasses</p>		
<p>PLATEAU</p>	<p>Flat land that is at a <i>high</i> elevation</p>		
<p>RANGE</p>	<p>A series of connected mountains</p>		
<p>VOLCANO</p>	<p>A mountain created as liquid rock or ash erupt from inside the earth</p> <p><i>Mt. Rainier</i> in our area is an example</p>
