

Book, Magazine, or Newspaper on a Web Site

Directions

Follow the directions for the book or magazine or newspaper entry except do NOT end with the word “Print.” *Title of the web site.* Web. Date of access.

What the Directions Mean

Go back to the directions for the book or magazine or newspaper entry and follow them exactly right up until the end, but don’t use the word “Print” to finish the entry.

Use italics to write the title of the web site. Period. Space.

Write the word “Web.” Period. Space.

Write the day and month and year you went to the site (abbreviate all but May, June, and July). Period.

The entry is finished!
