Informational Writing Checklist

I have the following things included in my report:	YES ✓
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A title that catches the attention of readers centered at the top of the page and my name centered underneath: <div style="text-align: center;">Crash Dummies by Ralph Nader</div> 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> An introductory paragraph that introduces your topic and “hooks” your readers (3-5 sentences) 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The body that is well-organized into at least 3 subtopics, and each subtopic gets a heading: <div style="text-align: center;">Testing Seat Belts</div> 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Each paragraph in the body is well-organized—each has a topic sentence and several additional sentences with important facts and details to support the topic sentence. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At least one of my paragraphs has a direct quotation from one of my sources. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At least one of my paragraphs has an image, which could be a photograph, a chart, or a graph 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> OPTIONAL—I even added a link to a video or audio clip to one paragraph 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A concluding paragraph that quickly summarizes my main points, wraps up what I want to say, and gets my biggest idea across 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> OPTIONAL—I even included a glossary (to define domain-specific vocabulary). 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bibliography (I used at least three credible sources, and I cited my sources, using the format my teachers asked me to use). 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I PROMISE THAT I DID NOT PLAGIARIZE. I TOOK NOTES WITHOUT COPYING. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I used formal language (no slang, contractions, abbreviations, and no first or second person pronouns). 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I used domain-specific language (proper scientific terms). 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I used transition words and phrases to connect ideas. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I followed the rules for correct spelling, punctuation, capitalization, grammar, and usage. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I asked my Learning Coach for help before I handed in my rough draft. I listened to their advice and followed it without complaining.

Sample MLA Citation List

Book

Author last name, author first name. *Book title*. Publication city: publishing company, publication year. Print.

Journal Article

Author last name, author first name. "Article title." *Journal title*. Volume number. Issue number (publication year): page numbers. Print.

Magazine Article

Author last name, author first name. "Article title." *Magazine title*. Date published: page numbers. Print.

Encyclopedia Article

Author last name, author first name. "Article title." *Encyclopedia title*. Edition. Publication City: Publication Company, publication year. Print.

Newspaper Article

Author last name, author first name. "Article title." *Newspaper title*. Date published: page numbers. Print.

Website

"Article title." Website publisher. The most recent date the website was published/updated. Web. The date you went to the site.

Book (Multiple Authors)

Johnson, Elliot J., ed. *Handbook of No-Till Agriculture*. Kansas City: CRC, 1993. Print.

Journal Article (One Author)

Powell, Hope D. "Implementation of GIS in Soil Analysis." *Soil Technology*. 47 (2003): 295-308. Print.

Journal Article (Multiple Authors)

Maddox, Alex L., Anna Ali, and Jamie McNamara. "Effect of Visiting Animals on Patient Recovery." *Hospital Observations*. 58.6 (2003): 12-18. Print.

Magazine Article

Fellon, Brad. "Aurora Borealis." *Travel*. May 2004: 36-41. Print.

Encyclopedia Article

Jones, Alessia. "Certificates of Deposit." *Encyclopedia of Finance*. Ed. James Michael Norton. 2nd ed. San Francisco: Macmillan, 2001. Print.
