


AGATE 5th Grade Supply List

Every child in the AGATE 5th grade class should have some things available at school all year:

- one composition book for the *Daily Dictionary*, the more unique and snazzy, the better
- one 2 to 3 inch 3-ring binder, the more plain and simple the better
- one set of 8 subject dividers with tabs



Parents, please see the back of this page for how you can help your child set up the binder dividers *before* arriving at school—that would help *so* much!

- a *continuous* supply of number 2 pencils
- a *continuous* supply of non-erasable dark blue ball point pens (not clicking)
- a *continuous* supply of red ball point pens (not clicking)
- a *continuous* supply of low-odor dry erase markers for math
- a container for their pens and pencils (a zipped bag to go in the 3-ring binder or a small box to go in their desk)
- an inexpensive flash drive

I'm also going to ask students to bring things to share, if they can:

- Every boy should bring a large box or two of Kleenex (the 200-tissue size or bigger).
- Every girl should bring a large container or two of wipes.

I don't require it, but I highly recommend that every child has a personal copy of the *MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers*, 7th Edition, that they can highlight and mark up. The middle school History Day competition and the high school English department uses MLA format, so this is a book that can be used for several years. You can get a paperback copy from amazon.com.

I should have plenty of markers and colored pencils for the year. I also have rulers and scissors to share. If students bring their own rulers or scissors, they should be clearly marked.
